## **ITEM CROWLEY 08**

The image for Item "Crowley 08," a MacBook Pro, was originally removed and imaged with onto a drive. The drive was formatted on NTFS. In order to process the image in Blacklight the image had to be copied to a drive that was formatted in exFAT so that it could be read by a Mac system. I copied the original image using Access Data (v3.1.4.6). I verified that the hash matched for both copies

The image was processed using Blacklight (V2014.2.2) on a forensic Mac Computer. I did not locate any items of note. The image file, an HTML report and the case folder were saved on ECU drive labeled 116.

## **ITEM CROWLEY 05**

Item Crowley 05 is a MacBook Pro. When the item was found it was powered on. The officers that collected the machine left it running and powered on. The ram was imaged using MacQuisition (v2014.1).

I saved the text document "myth." I powered down the computer. I booted the computer into MacQuisition. I noted that the time on the computer was 01/22/2015 at 1654 UTC and the actual was 01/22/2015 at 1653. I created an image (e01) file. The image was saved to drive 110.

The image was processed using Blacklight (V2014.2.2) on a forensic Mac Computer. I located the following items of note;

- Internet History- There was internet history logged on the computer as late as 12/25/2014 at 23:18:30 (UTC).
- Document of Note- A document labeled "myth" that was on the screen when officers arrived on the scene. The document read "I have loved you all with all of my heart."
- Journal Entries- the user "Kiskinikis" made several journal entries using the journaling application Day One. The data files and .PDF files were bookmarked. The journals are three separate files and cover the times periods of 04/13/2014-08/11/2014, 08/12/2014-09/04/2014 and 09/04/2014-09/10/2014.

The image file, HTML report and the case folder were saved to drive 110.
